Fireman Norm and the Brackley Fire Crew visit Farthinghoe Primary School!

As part of our 'Great Fire of London' learning in EYFS and keystage 1, we invited our Northamptonshire Fire and Rescue Community Safety Officer, Norm James, into school to talk with the children about fire safety and how it had changed and evolved since the Great Fire. Little did we know, Norm bought a real life fire engine with him too!! The fantastic Fire Crew from Brackley Fire Station gave the children a full tour of their engine – explaining what all the equipment was used for. They each had the opportunity to step aboard and put on the very heavy Fire helmets, after which they had the chance to aim and squirt the water hose. As the crew left they sounded their siren – which was very very loud!

During Norm's talk to the children he discussed the importance of fire safety both in school and at home. He has asked all the children to make sure their parents check their fire/smoke alarms at home to ensure they are working properly. The children also practised and recited the Fireman Sam song 'Stop, Drop & Roll'. Norm gave all the children a house point for their excellent listening and learning. Norm even said that if they show

Summer Sun- It's coming!

The weather is forecast to be (potentially) warm in the coming weeks so please can you ensure that children have water bottles in school that they can refill and hats to wear. It really helps if children apply suncream at home before they come in. You can buy suncreams which last for 6+ hours if applied once. Children are allowed to bring in their own suncream: please ensure that it is named and they can apply it themselves. If the weather is changeable, please ensure that your child has a lightweight waterproof jacket in school as they do go outside to play in light rain.
